# Pastoral Letter . . .

*Dear Friends,*

**As we move into November, often a month for remembrance and reflection, I can hardly believe that we are nearing the end of 2022. Much has happened this year, not least in relation to Presbytery planning, in response to the Radical Action Plan approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2019.**

As you know, St Mary's was placed within Zone 3 of Glasgow Presbytery's plan and we formed a cluster with Kirkintilloch: St David's Memorial Park, Lenzie Old and Lenzie Union. Using M&M contributions and parish population, ministry allocations were calculated for each zone and cluster by the Presbytery Mission Plan Creation Group (PMPCG). Our Zone was allocated 10.5 posts, which resulted in the allocation of 2 FTE; that is, 2 Ministers of Word and Sacrament for our cluster.

On Saturday 8th October and Tuesday 11th October, Glasgow Presbytery met, and the draft Presbytery Mission Plan for 2023-27 was approved. It will now be submitted to the Faith Nurture Forum and the General Trustees for their consideration and approval and can be found here:

Having completed a mission pro forma for our cluster in the summer, we were asked by the PMPCG to provide more detail on how we would use the 2 allocated ministry posts and what the future shape of our mission and ministry might look like. The feedback we received detailed the ways in which the cluster congregations could 'adjust'. These include: linkages, unions, team ministry, local mission churches, dissolution and a number of other options.

We met again as a cluster to discuss these options and it was proposed that St Mary's and St David's Memorial Park work together to explore the possible shape of a shared future and ministry. A similar proposal was made for the two Lenzie Churches to work together.

The Kirk Session of St Mary's met on 12th October and approved the proposal to take these next steps. There is a great deal to discuss and discern but I think it is important to clarify a couple of things:

1. Within the approved Presbytery Mission Plan, all buildings within our cluster have been categorised as A. It is, therefore, anticipated that all four sanctuaries will remain open within the life of this plan regardless of what shape ministry and mission will take.
2. Whilst the proposal to take this next exploratory step has been approved by the Kirk Sessions, it will be the congregations that approve future adjustments.

There is a great deal of work ahead of us but let us go forward as we always do, in faith. Let us seek Christ's lead and be open to the possibilities that lie before us. Let us ask our questions, share our hopes and fears and encourage one another. And, in and through it all, let us pray to God for the reforming and reshaping required across the Church, so that we can get on with the work of sharing the Good News of God's love in this place and beyond.

***In this month of remembrance and reflection, may God's peace be with you all.***

The Kirk Session met on 12th October, specifically to discuss progress in regard to our Presbytery Planning process and seek approval of the next steps. The draft plan has been approved by Presbytery and has now been submitted to the Faith Nurture Forum and the General Trustees for their consideration. In addition, the Kirk Session has approved the next steps being planned by our Cluster Group and Ruth has referred to these steps both from the pulpit and in her pastoral letter.

We are very much at the early stages of this process, but we are keen to share progress with you and discuss the way forward. To this end, it is proposed to hold a congregational meeting in the coming weeks, where we can share our thoughts, hear your views or concerns, and hopefully answer any questions you may have. Session meet again on the 9th November, at which time we would hope to be able to confirm a date and time for this meeting.

It has also been suggested that there should be an opportunity for members of the congregation to raise questions in writing and so we will have a box in the vestibule of the Church for the next few weeks for you to leave questions or comments for us. # Christmas is Coming ... ... nearer!

Last month we apologised for talking to you about Christmas but we do not need to apologise this month as we have reached November and Christmas is just round the corner.

Even Advent Sunday is in November this year. Over Two thousand years ago the wise men had probably already begun their journey by now and even if they were not actually travelling, they would certainly have been looking at the stars and making plans. If you are planning to be away on or before Christmas, you have probably also made plans even though your journey will not be as arduous as the wise men even if it is as long, even economy in a plane must be more comfortable than a camel! As part of your plans for Christmas we hope you have included joining your friends at St Mary's for the Advent Lunch. It will take place after the service on Sunday 11th December and will be a three course sit down lunch. The social committee are looking forward to sitting with you all for the meal this year and we have received very good reports about the caterers.

The choices for the meal will be:

**Starter** – Soup or Chicken Pate

**Main course** - Turkey with trimmings or Braised Beef with appropriate accompaniments.

## Two Minutes Silence

In the month when we think about those who have given their lives in war, the Two Minutes Silence is a significant act of remembrance. The silence provides an opportunity to remember those who have suffered in war and how we can work for a peaceful world. However, we can also find ourselves thinking about lunch or whether we've switched off our phone?

Victor Frankl, a victim of Auschwitz, suggested that the most intolerable of all human conditions is not imprisonment or hunger, but lack of meaning. The two minutes of silence enables us to connect with Jesus' message, which offers true meaning to our lives and world. He spoke of giving ourselves in love for each other and the world, 'Love your enemies and pray for those that persecute you' (Matthew 5:44). He also demonstrated such love in sacrificing His own life, 'Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends' (John 15:13). When observing the silence, let's use it to reflect on this sacrificial love, as we call to mind those who have laid down their lives.

In our busy lives, where so much clamours for our attention, silence gives us an opportunity to reflect on our priorities and rediscover true meaning in our lives. This is not just for Remembrance Sunday, as Jesus often withdrew to find silence to seek God (eg: Luke 5:16). Let's use silence in our lives as space to seek God's will and offer ourselves to Him, just as those who gave themselves in conflict through the years.

'They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning we will remember them.'

Since the trumpeter playing



You will also find that preaching about warfare and of man's inhumanity to man will give you greater insights into the working of your church council. The only difference is that on committees – sadly – the use of machine guns is rather frowned on.
